A donor advised fund (DAF) offers a simple, convenient solution. Think of it as your personal charitable giving account—a single place to organize, manage, and maximize your charitable impact.

How It Works

- **Open your fund:** Establish a donor advised fund through a community foundation or sponsoring organization with a simple written agreement. Most DAFs require a minimum initial gift, but additional contributions can be made in any amount.
- **Involve loved ones:** Name family members as successor advisors to continue recommending grants after your lifetime—or name University of the Cumberlands as a beneficiary of all or part of your account.
- **Grow your impact:** Your contributions are invested by the sponsoring organization, which provides regular statements and reporting.
- **Recommend grants:** You decide which charitable organizations to support, when, and how much.
- **Receive tax benefits:** You qualify for a federal income tax charitable deduction when you contribute to your DAF.

3 Tips for Choosing the Right Sponsoring Organization

- **Choose carefully:** Contributions to a DAF are irrevocable. Be sure the sponsoring organization aligns with your values and charitable goals.
- **Understand the rules:** Minimum contribution levels, grant recommendation guidelines, and frequency can differ by sponsor—know what to expect.
- **Review fees and performance:** Administrative fees and investment returns vary, which can affect how much is ultimately distributed to charity.

- **Simplicity:** Make one contribution to your DAF and support multiple organizations without tracking multiple receipts or records.
